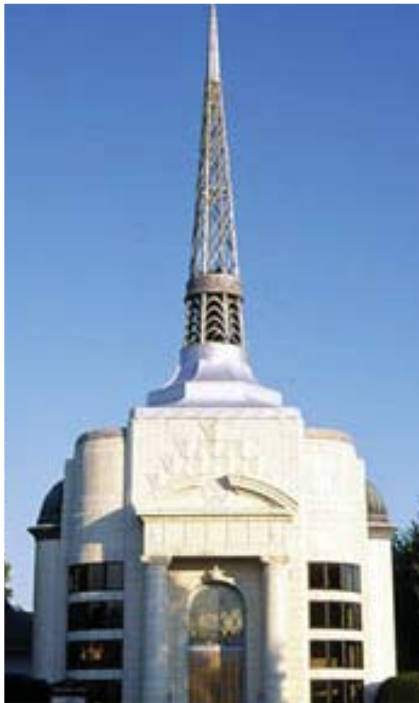


Tyson Temple United Methodist Church

- Located in Versailles, IN
- Owner: Tyson Temple United Methodist Church
- Project Description: Built in the midst of the Great Depression, the Versailles United Methodist Church was able to build this structure with money from a trust established by James Tyson, cofounder of Walgreens Drugstore. The white glazed brick and terra cotta exterior is adorned at the entry with two massive Egyptian influenced columns, which frame a pair of brooze doors, and an ornamental frieze. The building features the ambitious use of intricately designed masonry and metal material in its Art Deco design. The Tyson Temple was placed on the National Register of Historic Places on Sept. 8, 1995, because of its unique architecture.
